Bishop Franco, the General Secretary of Pentecostal Assemblies of God (PAG) Uganda, started his address with these words: **"God connects hearts from around the world for one purpose."**

At the Global Education Summit in October 2023, those words couldn't have been more true. This wasn't just a two-week conference. It was a time to bring together 29 leaders from 13 organizations, local Canadian leaders, likeminded organizations, friends of EduDeo, and faithful supporters---all to grow Christ-centred education around the world.

It's difficult to summarize the Summit's many impacts, but Bishop Franco's experience can give you a small snapshot. He and fellow participants travelled to Cairn Christian School in Stoney Creek, Ontario. It was this visit that stood out in his mind as a Summit highlight. **"There was a real sense of belonging, where everybody feels 'I am part of this community.'** Even the youngest children knows this and says, 'I want to go to school, I am not scared that there are adults in the school who teach me,' because they have a sense of belonging." Because it's not enough to just put children in a classroom. A classroom has to be a community of Christ.

So how did this experience impact Bishop Franco's perspective? He says: "We're not just here to be informative, but to form character in the children. I want to see a Christ-centered education that will transform Christians who will impact the places where God will send them and eventually be able to transform the nation for Christ."

MADE TO THRIVE IN ETHIOPIA

How Canadian schools stood up for their peers in Ethiopia---and did whatever they could to help them thrive.

Where you learn is almost as important as what you learn. In Ethiopia, not having enough classroom space can have severe consequences: the government can shut the school down completely. Challenges such as teacher shortages, material poverty, and the rising cost of living have made it very difficult for schools to meet the demand for increased classroom space.

And yet, teachers and students aren't just surviving, they're thriving. In the 2022-2023 school year, we invited Canadian Christian schools and others to help support the construction of nine new classrooms and a dining hall in Ethiopia, as well as support student bursaries.



Students, teachers, and schools in Ethiopia can continue thriving with their new classroom space.

Schools stepped up in a big way: they spread awareness, set up prayer partnerships, made new connections, and found creative ways to raise over \$51,000!

TEACHER TRAINING IN INDONESIA

FUTURE LEADERS WHO FEAR THE LORD

Did you know? Indonesia is a country of 279 million people spread across over 17,000 islands! That's a lot of ground to cover if you're trying to reach teachers and leaders with workshops and trainings!

But Rev. Yonson, the chair of EduDeo's partner Reformasi, isn't worried about the numbers. In fact, he sees it as an opportunity for growth and blessing!

"The training we receive is such a blessing for our people, our teachers, our students, our school that we are thinking, 'If we are expert on this, we would like to share with our neighbors.' We would like to be a channel of blessing to others. So as soon as we get some training, we will collect some other teachers that are close to us, and then we can share it with them and they can also implement it at their schools." Students around the world are being raised up to love God and others because YOU are investing in their teachers.

But all this training, all these workshops, all this learning and growing... what is it really for? Even the multiplication through sharing with others: what's the end goal for Reformasi?

"My deep hope is that each of our students will become a great future leader. That students will be leaders that fear the Lord and know the Lord, love the Lord, and serve the Lord with whatever gifts and talents and genius they have, and then serve others. I have real hope for our students using whatever they have for God's glory and serving others."

What's beautiful about Rev. Yonson's hope for his students is that it's not just Indonesia-specific. It's like this around the world with each of EduDeo's partners.

They believe—and we believe---that training teachers to guide students with the Gospel will produce future leaders who fear the Lord.
